MANAGER'S MONTHLY MEMO:

Summer has officially started and it seems like you blink and it's gone. Don't let summer pass by without enjoying the fun activities Coventry offers. Start with a bang with CoventryFest this Saturday and enjoy a summer concert, children's performance or the Farmers' Market. Don't miss the colonial encampment in this, the Nathan Hale Ancient Fifes and Drum Corps' 50th year (July 26th.) Enjoy, play safe...

A word on boating safety: If you are part of a boating rescue on Lake Wangumbaug, the emergency response forces usually stage at the boat launch. Please bring rescued victims to them there or call 911 to report your location.

A heads-up on tax bills: You will note that your payments need to be mailed to a different address this year. We are using a lock box vendor to speed the depositing and crediting to your account. You can of course still bring your payment to the Town Hall.

We urge you to "like" the Town's <u>Facebook page</u>. To receive updates on summer projects and their impact on traffic, sign up for road alerts/other closings through the <u>Alert Center</u> of our website. We are getting ready for road reclamation of the roads in the west side of Coventry Village: drainage first with reclamation around July 7th followed by pavement of the binder course later in July (final surface next year to verify drainage work was successful). Upper North River, Cedar Swamp and Bolton Branch are also scheduled for reclamation in July. Drainage work in Mountain Estates is scheduled for fall. The Town Hall/School Administration parking lot is also scheduled for paving in July. The Rt. 31 water project is wrapping up and reconstruction of the roadway/curve is scheduled for April of 2016.
